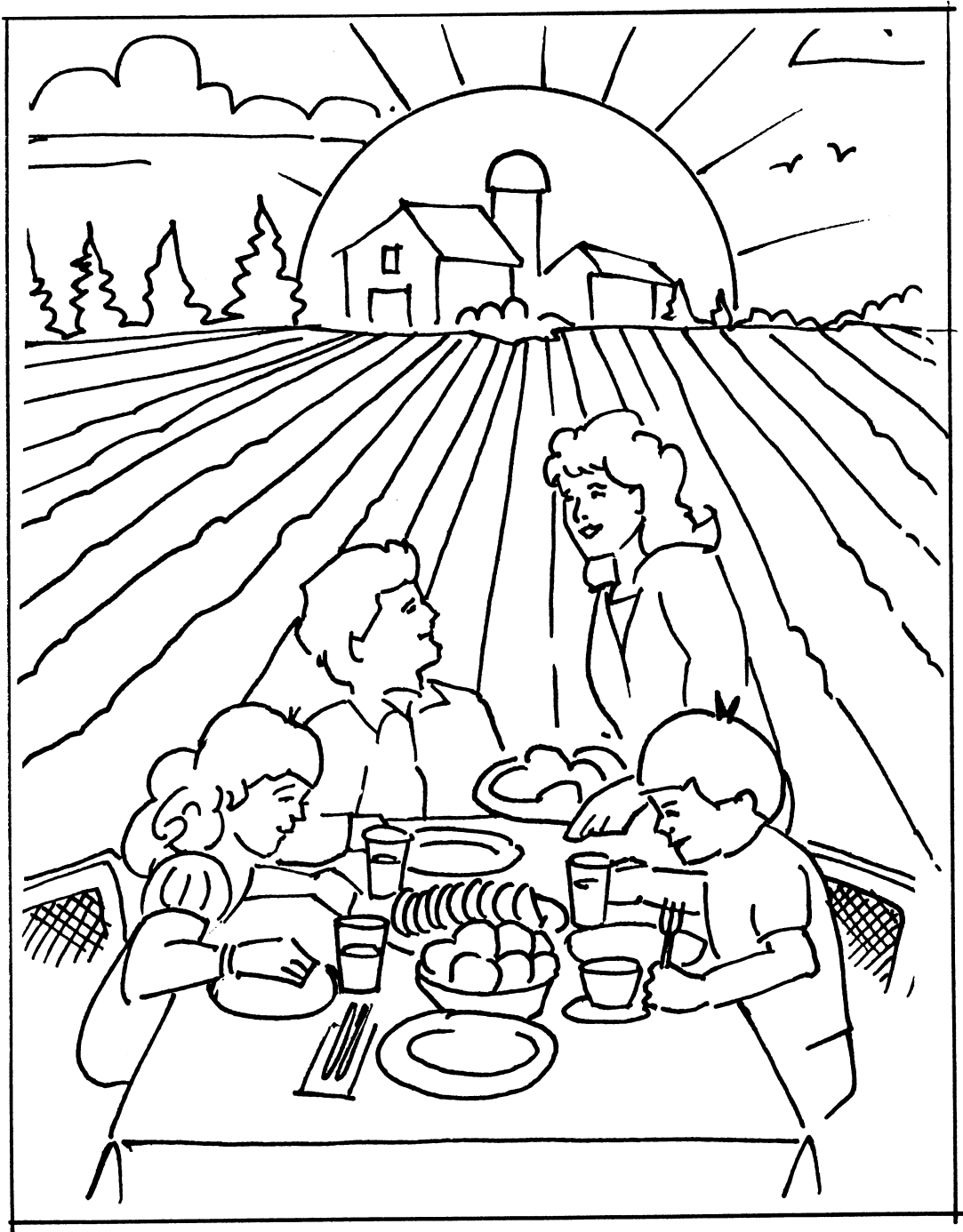

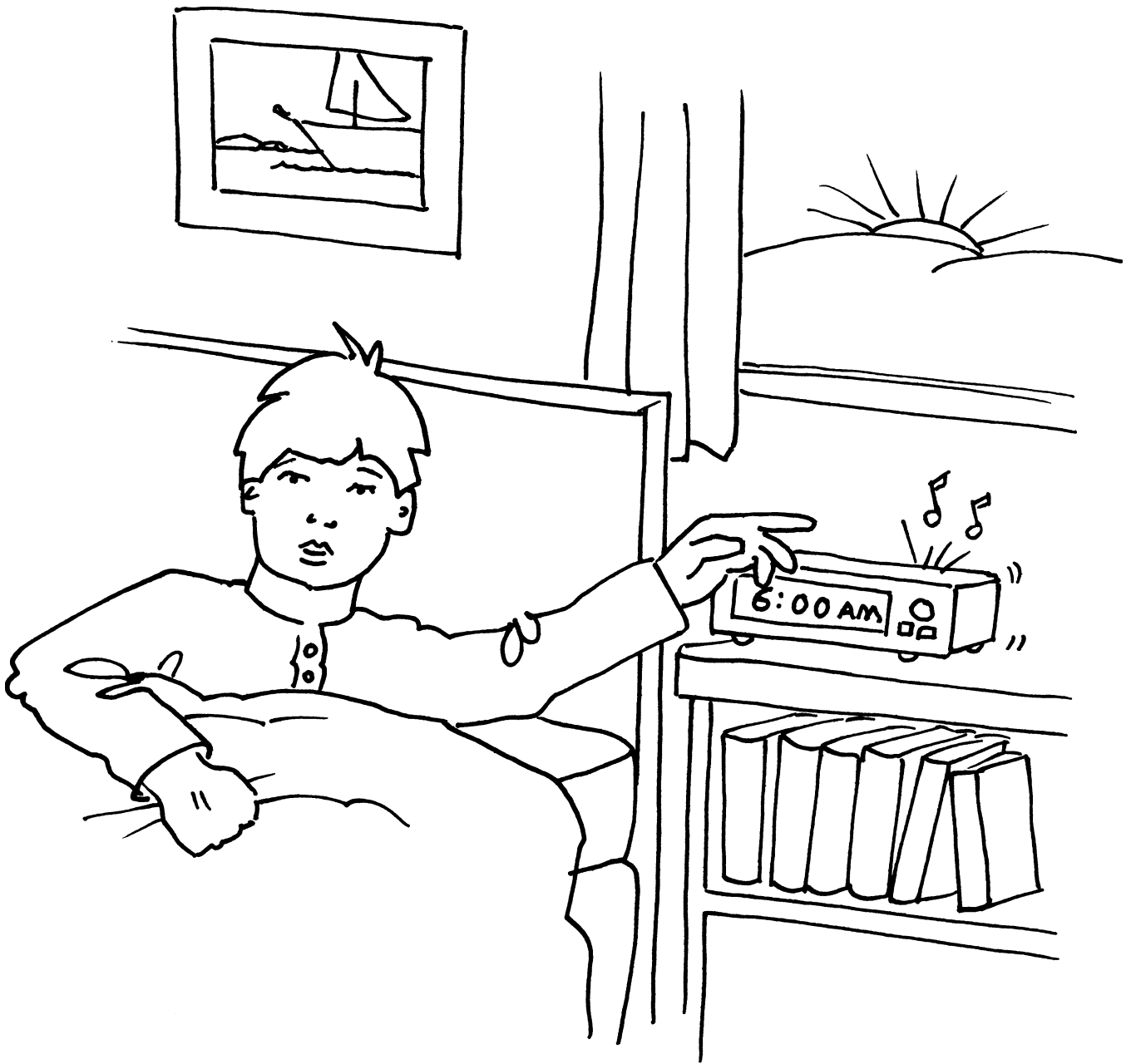

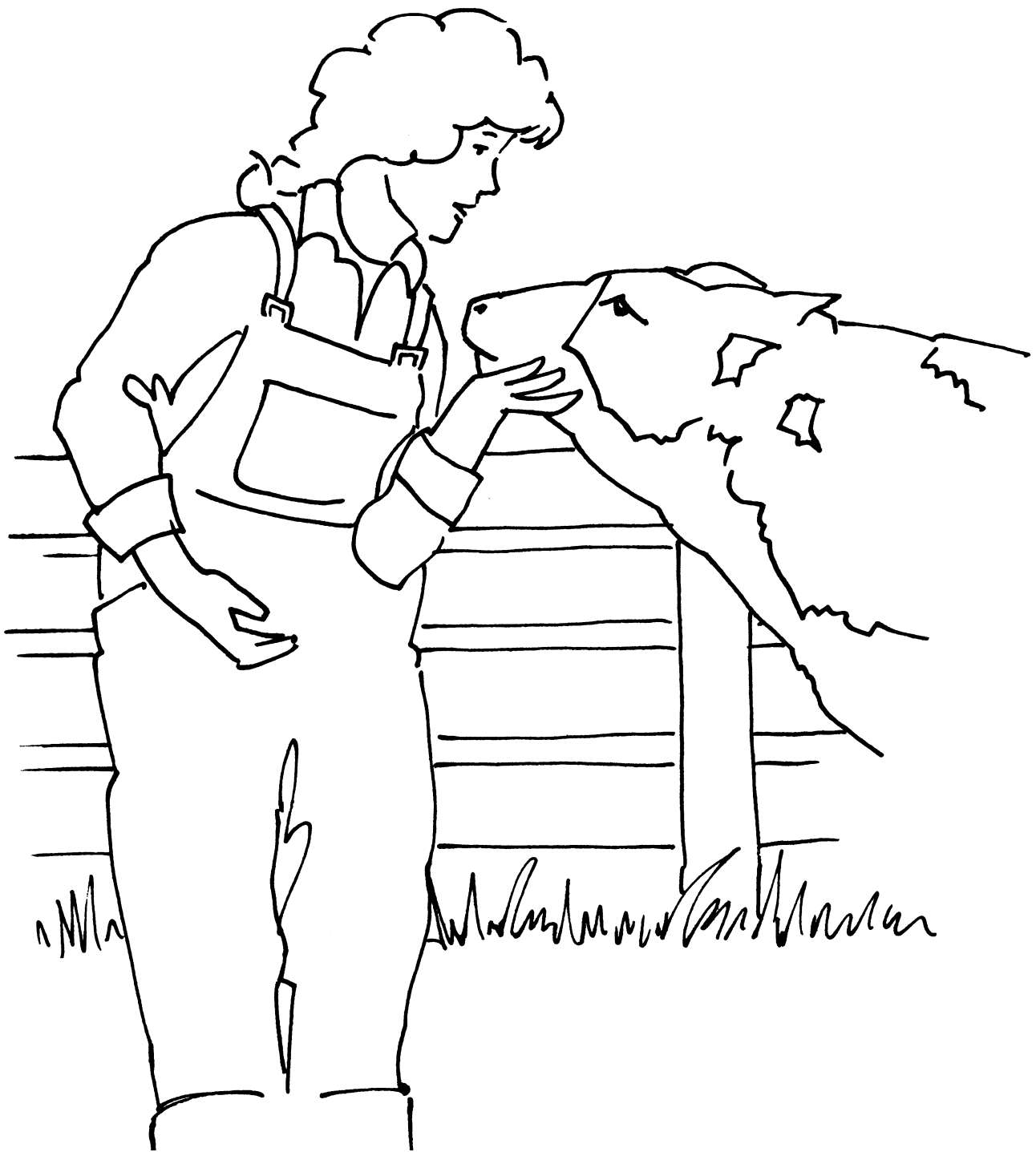


Many years ago, most people lived on farms, where they raised animals and crops for food and clothing.

But today, most of us live in cities. Luckily, some families still live and work on the farm. This book is about one of those families.



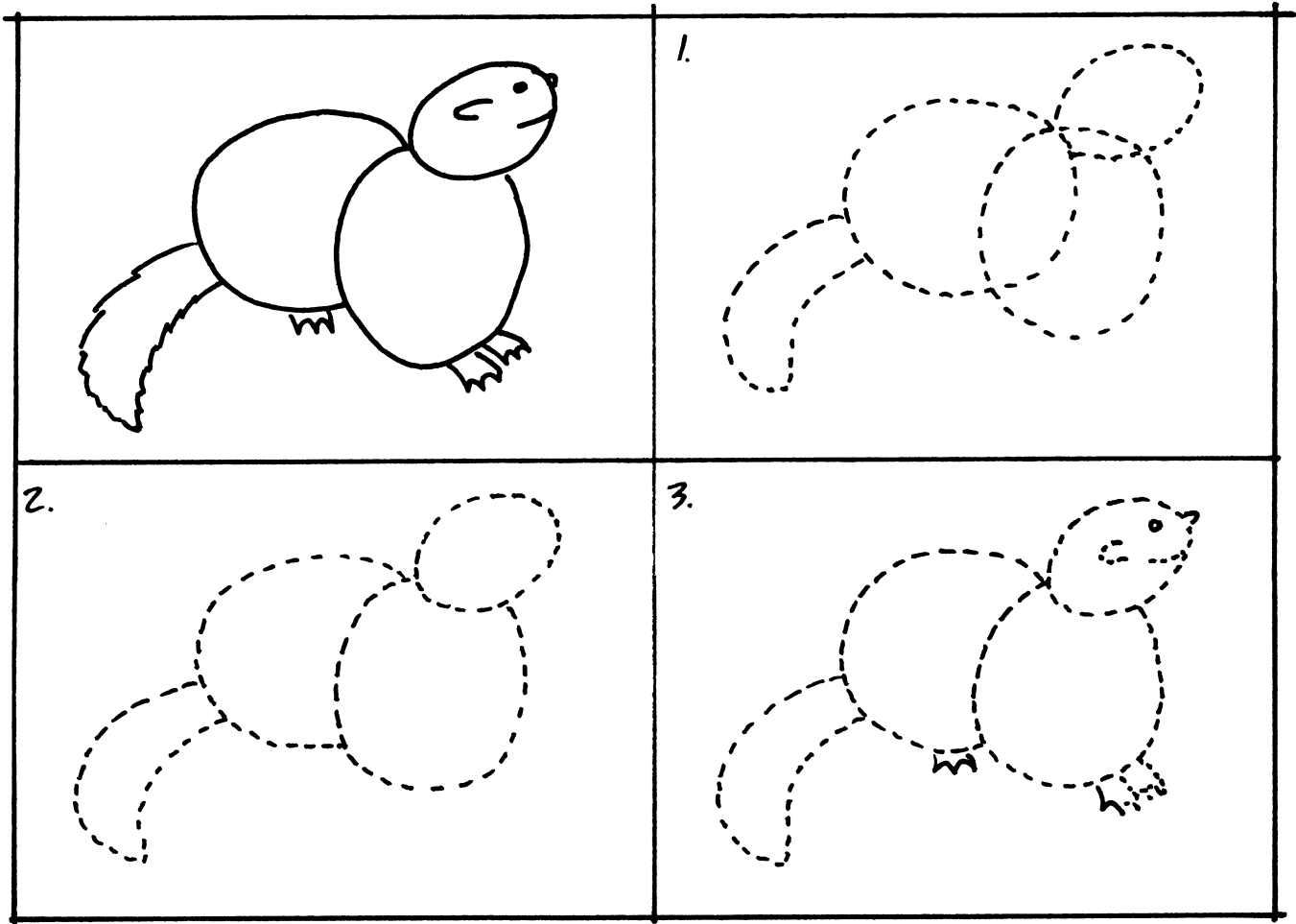
Raising animals is hard work. Billy gets up early every morning to help feed the animals and give them water.

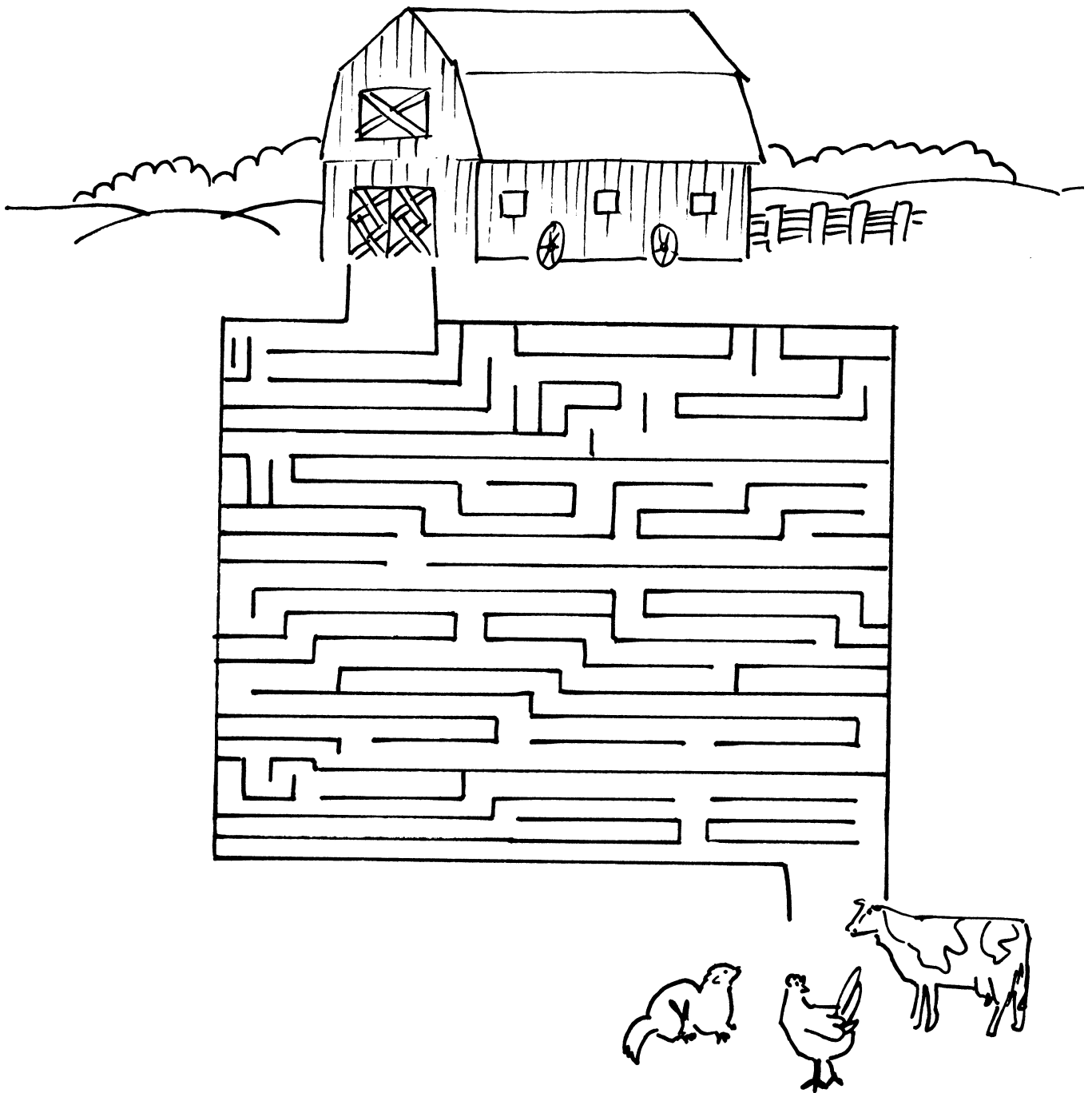
FOLLOW THE NUMBERED

Farmer Bob raises mink, too. He gives them good food and fresh water, cleans their cages and calls the animal doctor when they are sick.

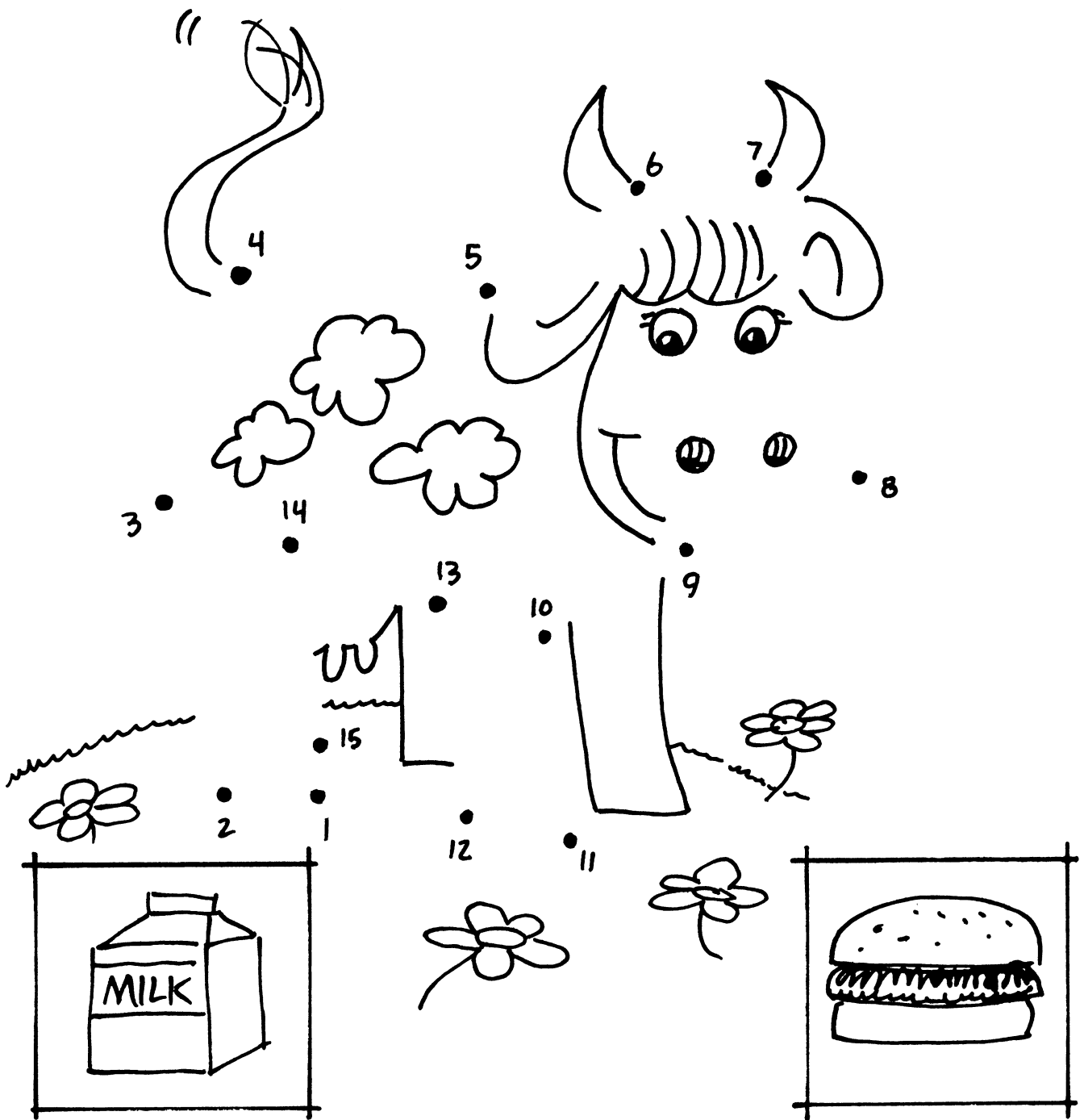


Every day, we buy hamburger, turkey, milk, chicken, eggs and other good food products in supermarkets.

Your dinner probably came from a farm just like farmer Bob's.

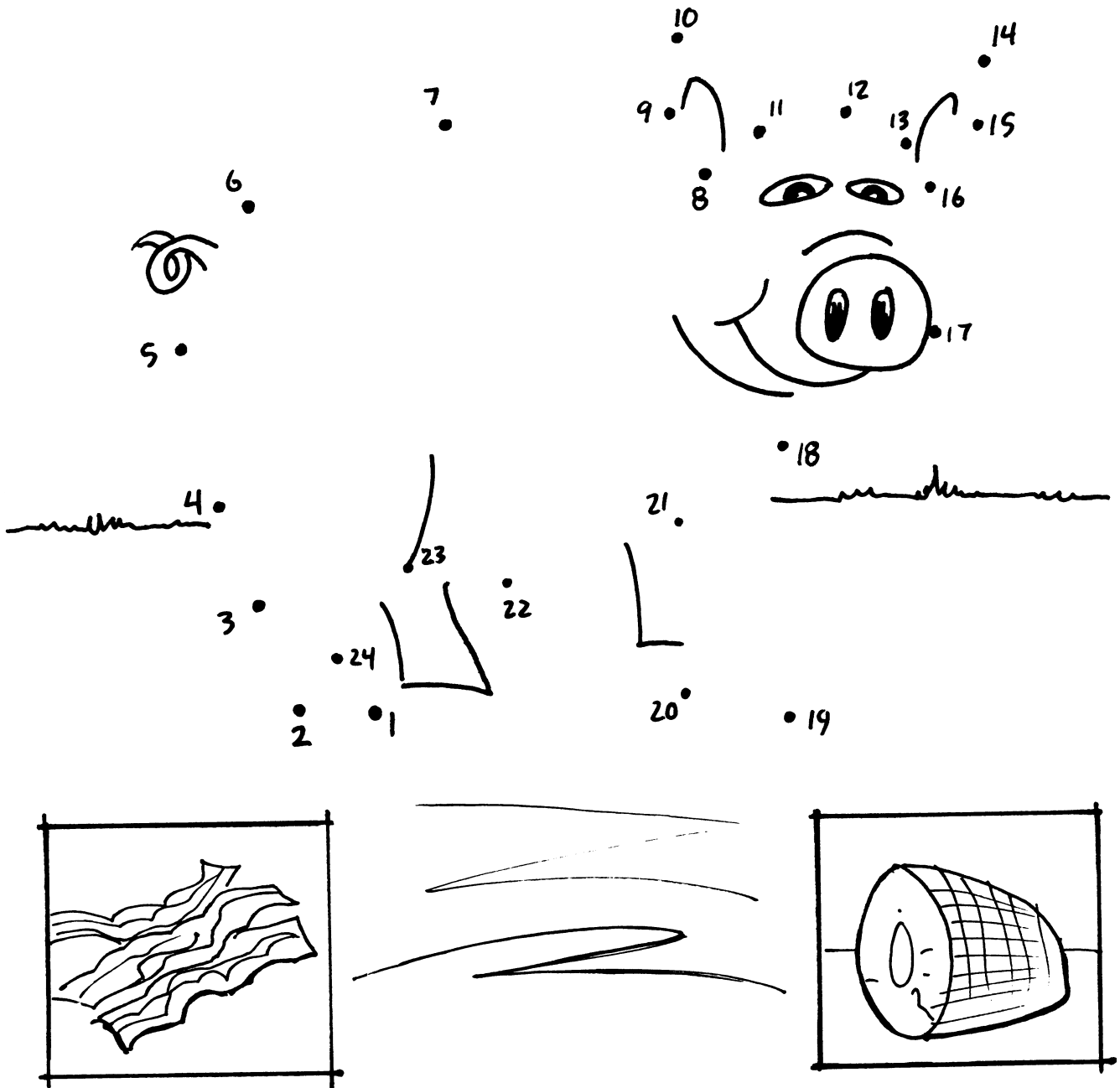

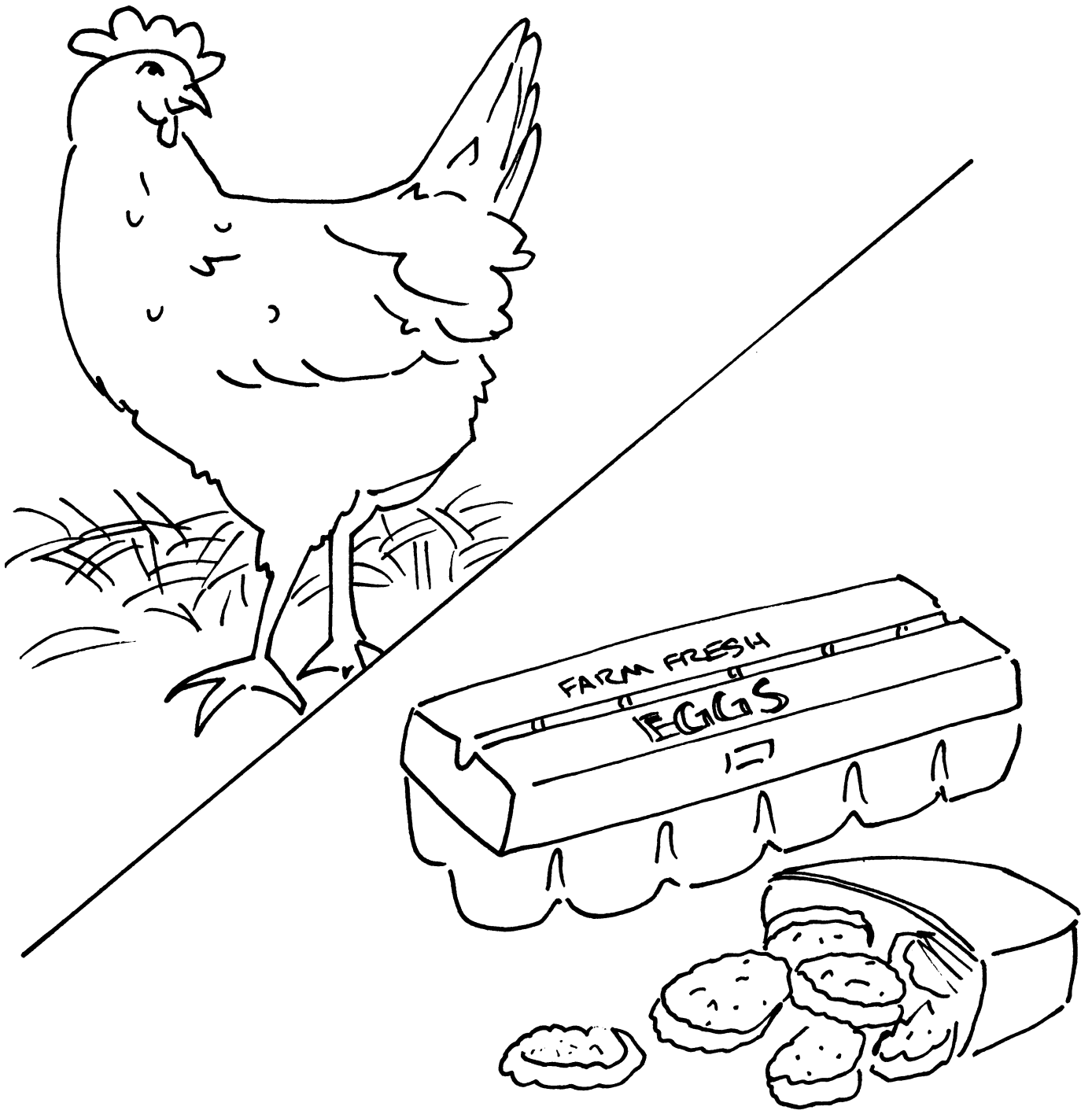
Cows give us fresh milk and hamburger.

Follow the dots to see where we get milk and hamburger.

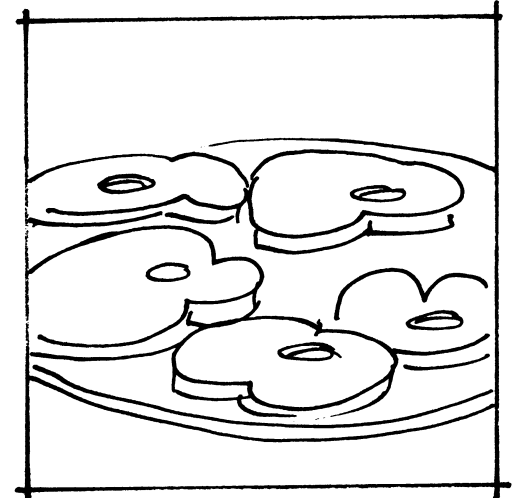
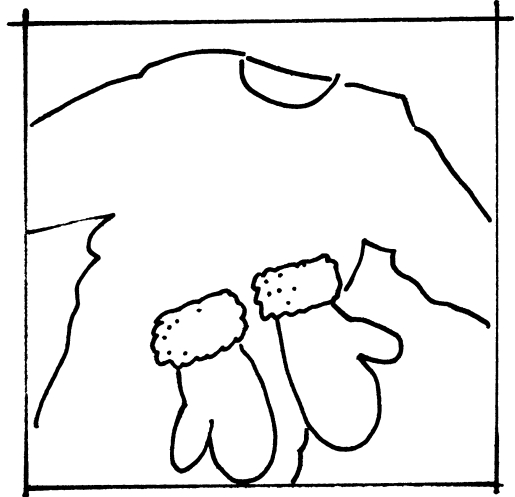
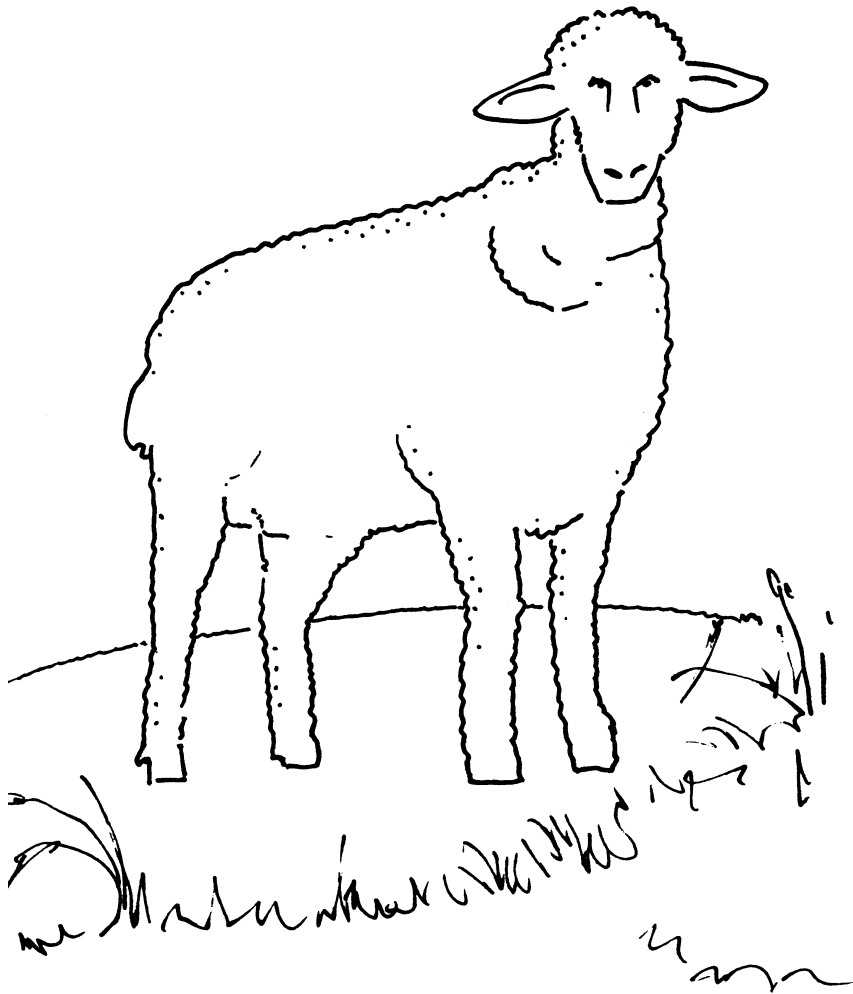


Pigs give us ham and bacon.

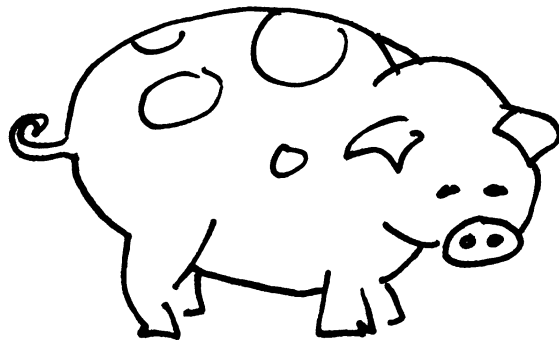
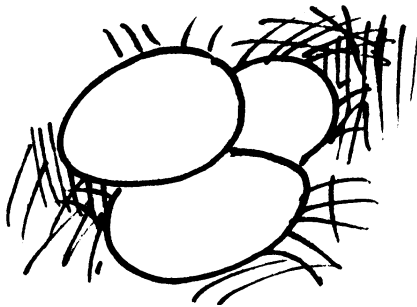
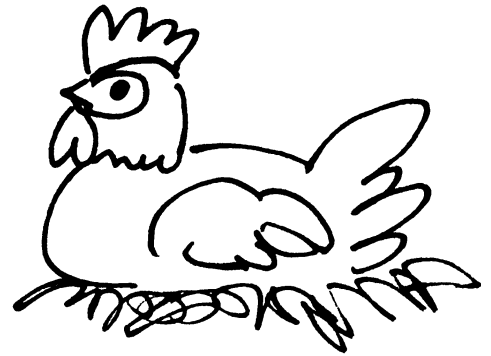
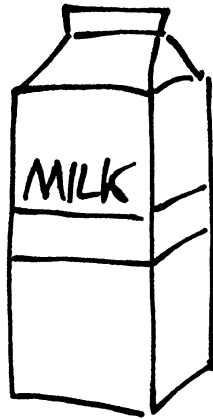
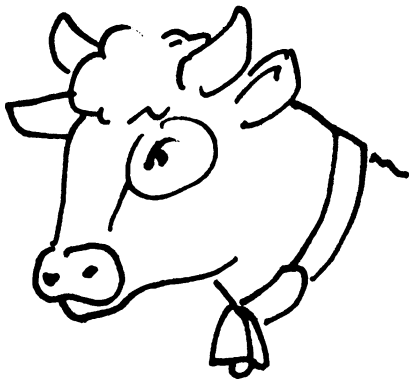
Follow the dots to see where we get ham and bacon.



Farmer Bob says, “From my chickens we get eggs to eat and chicken nuggets to enjoy.”

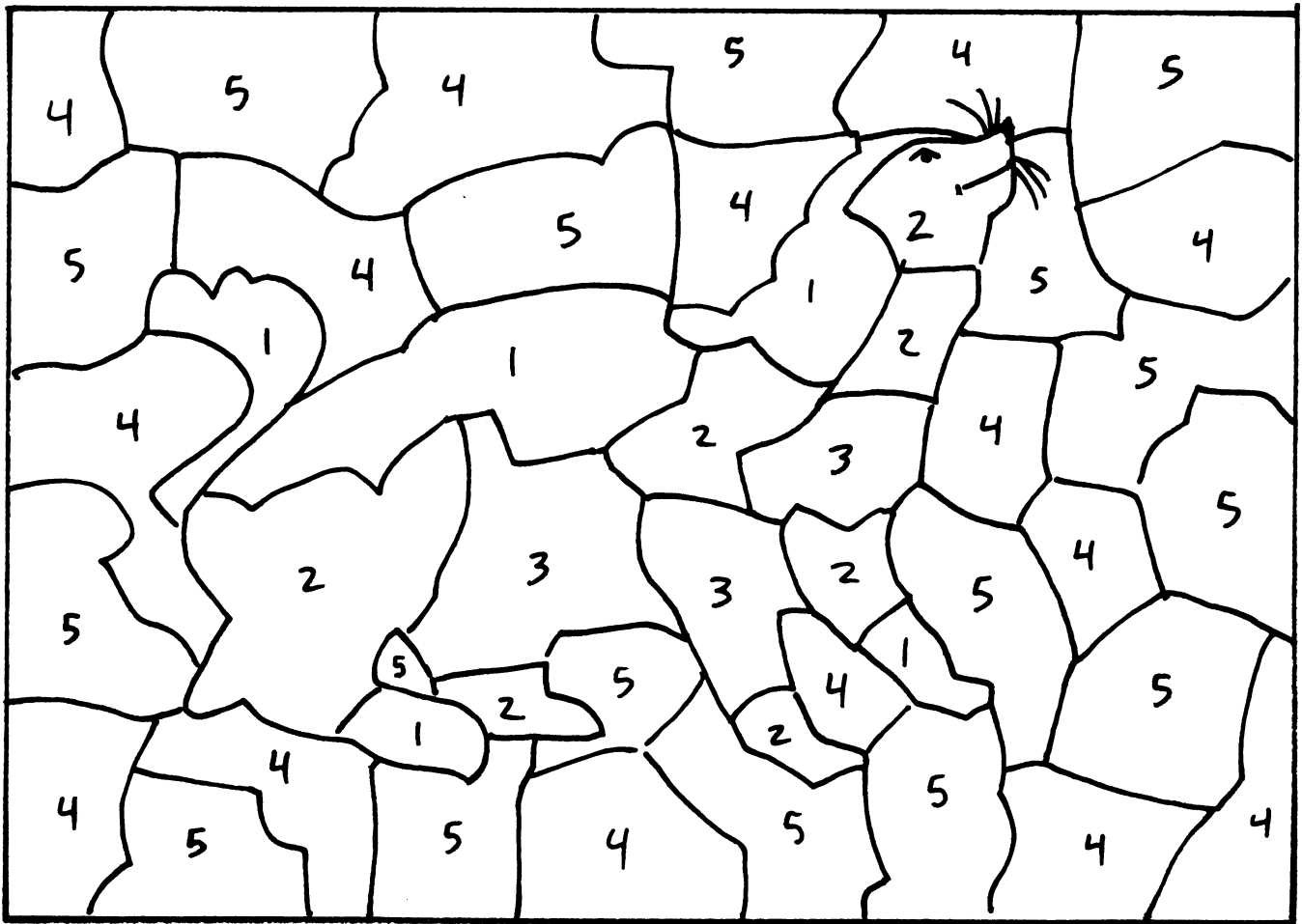


Fuzzy sheep give us wool for sweaters, and

When farmer Bob sends his animals to market, the leftovers come back to him so he can feed them to his mink. Mink love leftovers!

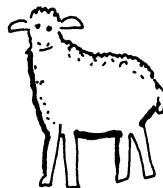
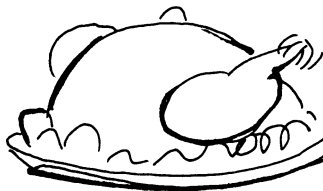
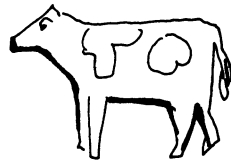
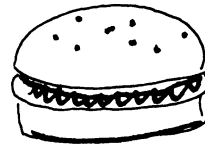
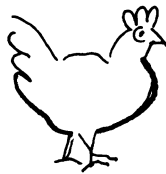
Farmer Bob says, "I'm glad my mink like leftovers. It means nothing is thrown away. We don't need any more garbage dumps."
